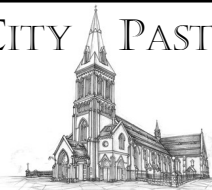

**SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ~ 6 MAY 2018**

Late last year I attended the Holy Trinity Anglican Cathedral Dedication with Bishop Pat and a few other Catholic Clergy. We were impressed with how Te Reo was integrated beautifully within the ceremony. Afterwards Bishop Pat and I both commented on how much Maori was used at Holy Trinity and how well the congregation responded.

Then last week I had the great pleasure of attending the Episcopal Ordination of Michael Dooley as seventh bishop of Dunedin Diocese at the Dunedin Town Hall. I was delighted when Bishop Colin Campbell, now Bishop Emeritus of Dunedin, began the mass and penitential rite in Te Reo Maori. The congregation were obviously used to this as their responses in Te Reo were loud and wholehearted. Here at the Cathedral we have been praying the Lord's Prayer in Maori since the beginning of Lent. Our use of Te Reo Maori is in keeping with the New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference and the Church's commitment to biculturalism and The Treaty of Waitangi.

Our hope is that we become more comfortable with Te Reo and are not flummoxed when we introduce it from time to time. In this regard we will continue praying the Lord's Prayer in Maori until Pentecost and then we will look at introducing other mass parts in Te Reo. In 1986 Pope John Paul II visited Aotearoa NZ and at a mass at the Auckland Domain he said: "A rich culture already existed in your country before the arrival of the Church or many immigrants: the culture of the Māori people. This culture has in turn been strengthened by the uplifting and purifying power of the Gospel. I wish to extend special greetings to you, the Māori people of Aotearoa ... As you rightly treasure your culture, let the Gospel of Christ continue to penetrate and permeate it, confirming your sense of identity as a unique part of God's household. It is as Māori that the Lord calls you; it is as Māori that you belong to the Church, the one body of Christ."

Following on from his comments a Maori Pastoral Care Plan was developed and this document

continues to be the foundation of the Catholic Church's commitment to biculturalism and Te Tiriti o Waitangi.

It is also interesting that in his encyclical Laudato Si' Pope Francis says: "It is essential to show special care for indigenous communities and their cultural traditions. They are not merely one minority among others, but should be the principal dialogue partners, especially when large projects affecting their land are proposed. For them, land is not a commodity but rather a gift from God and from their ancestors who rest there, a sacred space with which they need to interact if they are to maintain their identity and values."

I am most grateful to our Sunday congregations for all your efforts in praying the Lord's Prayer in Maori over these past weeks. Each week we seem to be getting more and more proficient and while some of us struggle with some of the longer words or phrasing, we are at least becoming more familiar with the Maori language and are honouring and respecting our bicultural commitment. My late father, a gifted orator in Maori and English, would always encourage non Maori, when visiting our marae, to speak a few words in Maori. He would always say, "ahakoa he iti, he pounamu" Even if it is just a word or two, it will be treasured like greenstone. Dad loved it when non Maori would make an effort and give Te Reo a go! Even if they stumbled and faltered and didn't quite get the pronunciation right. He would sit on the taumata (speakers seat) and with a proud smile, he would be nodding and encouraging them on with the words "Kia Ora, Kia Ora!!" Similarly, I have been encouraged by listening to your voices blending with the priest's in praying the Lord's Prayer in Maori. Your efforts are appreciated and your support of Te Reo, heartening!
