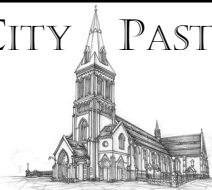

THE MOST HOLY TRINITY ~ 27 MAY 2018

Last Saturday night I was one of the several billion people worldwide tuned in to the royal wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle. Aside from all the pomp and pageantry I was transfixed by the energy and enthusiasm of the American evangelist Bishop Michael Curry, who certainly stirred up the usually staid royal proceedings. His sermon on Love gave a powerful message indeed. Later in the ceremony I was delighted and impressed by a Black Gospel Choir singing "Stand By Me." Roving reporters presented some wonderful interviews with people of mixed race.

These were superb insights into how people were feeling and especially for those of mixed race a real sense of validation was felt, now that a woman of mixed race herself was marrying into the British Monarchy! Barriers have been broken down and boundaries removed as a result of this union. Bishop Curry's sermon on love reminds us that what we celebrate in the Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit is their unconditional love for each other and by extension for each of us as well. Here are some extracts from his sermon:

"There's power in love to help and heal when nothing else can. There's power in love to lift up and liberate when nothing else will. There's power in love to show us the way to live." *"Someone once said that Jesus began the most revolutionary movement in human history. A movement grounded in the unconditional love of God for the world - and a movement mandating people to live that love, and in so doing to change not only their lives but the very life of the world itself."*

He went on to illustrate the power of this love; *".....some old slaves in America's Antebellum South explained the dynamic power of love and why it has the power to transform. They sang a spiritual, even in the midst of their captivity. It's one that says "There is a balm in Gilead a healing balm, something that can*

make things right. There is a balm in Gilead to make the wounded whole, there is a balm in Gilead to heal the sin-sick soul." And one of the stanzas actually explains why: *"If you cannot preach like Peter, and you cannot pray like Paul, you just tell the love of Jesus, how he died to save us all."* He sacrificed his life, for the good of others, for the wellbeing of the world... for us. That's what love is. Love is not selfish and self-centred. Love can be sacrificial, and in so doing, becomes redemptive. And that way of unselfish, sacrificial, redemptive love changes lives, and it can change this world. When love is the way, then no child will go to bed hungry in this world ever again.

When love is the way, we will let justice roll down like a mighty stream and righteousness like an ever-flowing brook.

When love is the way, poverty will become history. When love is the way, the earth will be a sanctuary.

When love is the way, we will lay down our swords and shields, down by the riverside, to study war no more.

When love is the way, there's plenty good room for all of God's children.

"Because when love is the way, we actually treat each other, well... like we are actually family.

When love is the way, we know that God is the source of us all, and we are brothers and sisters, children of God.

May the holy love of Father, Son and Holy Spirit capture us and enflame us in the Mission to love and to serve. ~ ~ Blessings, Pa Peter

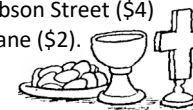
